Meeting Minutes

SIC Officers/Members Present: Diane Threlkeld, Darryl Kosiorek, Nicole Seay, Amanda Garrett, Timothy Reece, and Brandon Baynard

Nicole Seay called the meeting to order at 3:00 pm.

Nicole Seay welcomed all members and introduced Amanda Garret, who was not present at previous meetings.

Nicole Seay shared the minutes from the meeting on Thursday, November 16, 2017. A motion was made by Diane Threlkeld to approve the minutes. No discussion took place. A second motion was made and the council voted unanimously to approve the minutes from the last SIC meeting.

Nicole Seay reported that the district has implemented an SRO rotation that allows our school to have an SRO present on the grounds once a week. Nicole also informed the board of additional programs being used to aid our students. These programs include the Blue Jay Scholars, Morning Math Nest, and Epic Gains. Each program was described to the members so that everyone had a clear understanding of the services they provided and the ways in which they are beneficial to our students who attend these programs. Ms. Seay reported on the AdvancED visit that occurred. Diane Threlkeld shared her experience with her class being observed and the conversations had with the AdvancEd visitors during our TLT meetings. The teachers present, Diane Threlkeld, Nicole Seay, and Amanda Garrett, all discussed how well they thought the visit went and the fact that they are looking forward to the report from the AdvancED Team.

Nicole Seay talked about the success of Literacy Night, the upcoming Science Fair, and provided a flyer with details about the upcoming Health Fair Family Night. There was some discussion about making sure we are not trying to do too many extracurricular activities after school due to the fact that so many families have spring sports, multiple jobs, or multiple children which may not allow them to participate in the afterschool activities. Those in attendance discussed making sure we are trying to correlate our activities with our feeder school to try and avoid any conflicts with families who have children at other schools in the district.

Brandon Baynard discussed that there are still some traffic issues at the intersection of Highway 9 and 4<sup>th</sup> street. He also informed the committee that there are a few traffic issues in the afternoon on the 400 wing during dismissal. He suggested having someone begin collecting car numbers earlier if at all possible, having parents whose cars are not loaded or who have a transportation change/conflict move forward out of the way so the flow of traffic can continue. He stated that many parents have to pick up at multiple schools and become frustrated when traffic moves slowly.

Nicole Seay informed the committee of the upcoming Pancake Breakfast at Fatz Café in Boiling Springs. Teachers will earn comp time and the funds raised will go directly to purchasing books for classroom libraries.

The SIC's next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 15, 2018 from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm in the Media Center.

The meeting was adjourned by Nicole Seay at 4:00 pm.
